## CERTIFICATE OF INCORPORATION

BE IT KNOWN, That "The Town of McMinnville"<sup>1</sup> Warren County Tennessee, with metes and bounds as follows: Beginning at the center of the lane between J. W. Smith's property running north across the railroad thence with the dirt road to a drain out of Reavis' field or Lewis' field thence in a north west direction so as to include the residence and improvements of Mrs. Thomas Faulkner and thence north west so as to include the improvements of Frank Womack and thence west so as to include the residence of T. H. Wieneer and Pierce; thence in a straight line to the Baron Fork River so as to include Drury and James Rankins or where he now lives; thence down the Baron Fork River with its various meanderings to a point opposite the residence of Bradley Rice so as to include his residence, thence to the beginning<sup>2</sup> is hereby duly, and legally incorporated and as such, is entitled to all the benefits and subject to all the responsibilities of the laws of the state applicable to municipal corporations.
