ISO Credit for Residential Sprinklers

- ISO reduces the needed fire flow (NFF) for all properly sprinklered residential properties
- For residential occupancies such as apartments and hotels protected with an automatic fire sprinkler system installed in accordance with the general criteria of NFPA 13R, Standard for the Installation of Sprinkler Systems in Residential Occupancies up to and including Four Stories in Height, the Needed Fire Flow is either the demand at the base of the automatic sprinkler riser or 1,000 gpm at 20 psi for a duration of 2 hours, whichever is greater.

- The Fire Suppression Rating Schedule (FSRS) manual contains the criteria ISO uses in reviewing the firefighting capabilities of individual communities. The FSRS measures the major elements of a community's fire suppression system and develops a numerical grading called a Public Protection Classification (PPC). ISO sells the manual for \$100, however:
- Fire chiefs, chief building officials, and community chief administrative officials may request a single copy of the FSRS or BCEGS free of charge.




