# CHAPTER 1

#### FIRE DISTRICT

### **SECTION**

7-101. Fire limits described.

**7-101.** <u>Fire limits described</u>. The corporate fire limits shall be that area designated as the central business district at such time as the city adopts a zoning ordinance. Until that time there are no fire limits. (1978 Code,  $\S$  7-101)

**7-201.** Fire code adopted. Pursuant to authority granted by <u>Tennessee</u> <u>Code Annotated</u>, §§ 6-54-501 through 6-54-506, and for the purpose of prescribing regulations governing conditions hazardous to life and property from fire or explosion, the <u>Standard Fire Prevention Code</u>,<sup>2</sup> 1994 edition, as recommended by the Southern Standard Building Code Congress International, Inc. is hereby adopted by reference and included as a part of this code. Pursuant to the requirement of <u>Tennessee Code Annotated</u>, § 6-54-502, one (1) copy of the fire prevention code has been filed with the city recorder and is available for public use and inspection. Said fire prevention code is adopted and incorporated as fully as if set out at length herein and shall be controlling within the corporate limits. (1978 Code, § 7-201, modified)

**7-202.** <u>Enforcement</u>. The fire prevention code herein adopted by reference shall be enforced by the chief of the fire department. He shall have the same powers as the state fire marshal. (1978 Code, § 7-202)

**7-203.** <u>Definition of "municipality</u>." Whenever the word "municipality" is used in the fire prevention code herein adopted, it shall be held to mean the City of Charleston, Tennessee. (1978 Code, § 7-203)

**7-204.** <u>Storage of explosives, flammable liquids, etc</u>. (1) The limits referred to in § 1901.4.2 of the fire prevention code, in which storage of explosive

materials is prohibited, is hereby declared to be the fire limits as set out in § 7-101 of this code at such time as such limits are set.

(2) The limits referred to in § 902.1.1 of the fire prevention code, in which storage of flammable or combustible liquids in outside above ground tanks is prohibited, is hereby declared to be the fire limits as set out in § 7-101 of this code at such time as such limits are set.

(3) The limits referred to in § 906.1 of the fire prevention code, in which new bulk plants for flammable or combustible liquids are prohibited, is hereby declared to be the fire limits as set out in § 7-101 of this code at such time as such limits are set.

(4) The limits referred to in § 1701.4.2 of the fire prevention code, in which bulk storage of liquefied petroleum gas is restricted, is hereby declared to be the fire limits as set out in § 7-101 of this code at such time as such limits are set. (1978 Code, § 7-204)

**7-205.** <u>Gasoline trucks</u>. No person shall operate or park any gasoline tank truck within the central business district or within any residential area at any time except for the purpose of and while actually engaged in the expeditious delivery of gasoline. (1978 Code, § 7-205)

**7-206.** <u>Variances</u>. The chief of the volunteer fire department may recommend to the board of commissioners variances from the provisions of the fire prevention code upon application in writing by any property owner or lessee, or the duly authorized agent of either, when there are practical difficulties in the way of carrying out the strict letter of the code, provided that the spirit of the code shall be observed, public safety secured, and substantial justice done. The particulars of such variances when granted or allowed shall be contained in a resolution of the board of commissioners. (1978 Code, § 7-206)

**7-207.** <u>Violations</u>. It shall be unlawful for any person to violate any of the provisions of this chapter or the <u>Standard Fire Prevention Code</u> herein adopted, or fail to comply therewith, or violate or fail to comply with any order made thereunder; or build in violation of any detailed statement of specifications or plans submitted and approved thereunder, or any certificate or permit issued thereunder, and from which no appeal has been taken; or fail to comply with such an order as affirmed or modified by the board of commissioners or by a court of competent jurisdiction, within the time fixed herein. The application of a penalty under the general penalty clause for the municipal code shall not be held to prevent the enforced removal of prohibited conditions. (1978 Code, § 7-207)

## **CHAPTER 3**

## **VOLUNTEER FIRE DEPARTMENT**<sup>1</sup>

**7-301.** Establishment, equipment, and membership. There is hereby established a fire department to be supported and equipped from appropriations by the board of commissioners. All apparatus, equipment, and supplies shall be purchased by or through the city and shall be and remain the property of the city. The volunteer fire department shall be composed of a chief appointed by the city manager and such number of physically-fit subordinate officers and firemen as the city manager shall appoint. (1978 Code, § 7-301)

7-302. <u>Objectives</u>. The volunteer fire department shall have as its objectives:

- (1) To prevent uncontrolled fires from starting.
- (2) To prevent the loss of life and property because of fires.
- (3) To confine fires to their places of origin.
- (4) To extinguish uncontrolled fires.
- (5) To prevent loss of life from asphysiation or drowning.

(6) To perform such rescue work as its equipment and/or the training of its personnel makes practicable. (1978 Code, § 7-302)

**7-303.** <u>Organization, rules, and regulations</u>. The chief of the volunteer fire department shall set up the organization of the department, make definite assignments to individuals, and shall formulate and enforce such rules and regulations as shall be necessary for the orderly and efficient operation of the volunteer fire department. (1978 Code, § 7-303)

**7-304.** <u>Records and reports</u>. The chief of the volunteer fire department shall keep adequate records of all fires, inspections, apparatus, equipment, personnel, and work of the department. He shall submit a written report on such matters to the city manager once each month, and at the end of the year a detailed annual report shall be made. (1978 Code, § 7-304)

**7-305.** <u>Tenure of members</u>. The chief shall hold office so long as his conduct and efficiency are satisfactory to the city manager. However, so that adequate discipline may be maintained, the chief shall have the authority to suspend any other member of the fire department when he deems such action to be necessary for the good of the department. The chief may be suspended up to thirty (30) days or dismissed by the city manager. (1978 Code, § 7-305)

**7-306.** <u>Chief responsible for training and maintenance</u>. The chief of the volunteer fire department shall be fully responsible for the training of the firemen and for maintenance of all property and equipment of the fire department. The minimum training shall consist of having the personnel take the fire apparatus out for practice operations not less than once a month. (1978 Code, § 7-306)

7-307. <u>Chief to be assistant to state officer</u>. Pursuant to requirements of <u>Tennessee Code Annotated</u>, § 68-102-108, the chief of the volunteer fire department is designated as an assistant to the state commissioner of commerce and insurance and is subject to all the duties and obligations imposed by <u>Tennessee Code Annotated</u>, title 68, chapter 102, and shall be subject to the directions of the commissioner in the execution of the provisions thereof. (1978 Code, § 7-307)

## **CHAPTER 4**

#### **FIREWORKS**

# SECTION

7-401. Permit required for engaging in the sale of fireworks.7-402. Use of fireworks.

7-401. <u>Permit required for engaging in the sale of fireworks</u>. Persons desiring to sell fireworks within the corporate limits of the City of Charleston, Tennessee, shall first obtain a written permit from the city manager after production of a sales tax certificate, City of Charleston business license, Bradley County, Tennessee business license and a State of Tennessee Fire Marshall's license. (Ord. of Feb 8, 1994)

**7-402.** <u>Use of fireworks</u>. No person shall shoot or use fireworks within the corporate limits of Charleston, Tennessee, except on federally designated and State of Tennessee designated holidays, and in no event later than 11:00 o'clock p.m. (Ord. of Feb 8, 1994)
