- 12-304. <u>Violations</u>. It shall be unlawful for any person to do or authorize any electrical work or to use any electricity in such manner or under such circumstances as not to comply with this chapter and/or the requirements and standards prescribed by the electrical code. (1974 Code, § 4-304)
- 12-305. Enforcement. The electrical inspector shall be the building inspector for Dickson County. It shall be his duty to enforce compliance with this chapter and the electrical code as herein adopted by reference. He is authorized and directed to make such inspections of electrical equipment and wiring, etc., as are necessary to insure compliance with the applicable regulations, and may enter any premises or building at any reasonable time for the purpose of discharging his duties. He is authorized to refuse or discontinue electrical service to any person or place not complying with this chapter and/or the electrical code. - 12-401. <u>Gas code adopted</u>. The purpose of the gas code is to provide minimum standards, provisions, and requirements for safe installation of consumer's gas piping and gas appliances. All gas piping and gas appliances installed, replaced, maintained, or repaired within the corporate limits shall conform to the requirements of this chapter and to the <u>Standard Gas Code</u>, 1991 edition, with 1992 and 1992-93 revisions, which is hereby incorporated by reference and made a part of this chapter as if fully set forth herein. One (1) copy of the gas code shall be kept on file in the office of the city clerk for the use and inspection of the public. (Ord. #91-10-2, May 1991, modified)
- 12-402. <u>Definitions</u>. The following definitions are provided for the purpose of interpretation and administration of the gas code.
- (1) "Inspector" means the person appointed as inspector, and shall include each assistant inspector, if any, from time to time acting as such under this chapter by appointment of the city council.<sup>3</sup>
- (2) "Person" means any individual, partnership, firm, corporation, or any other organized group of individuals.
- (3) "Gas company" means any person distributing gas within the corporate limits or authorized and proposing to so engage.
- (4) "Certificate of approval" means a document or tag issued and/or attached by the inspector to the inspected material, piping, or appliance

- (5) "Certain appliances" means conversion burners, floor furnaces, central heating plants, vented wall furnaces, water heaters, and boilers. (1974 Code, § 4-402)

The gas inspector shall be authorized and is hereby directed to make any and all necessary inspections of gas equipment, appliances and piping to insure compliance with the gas code and may enter any premises or building at any reasonable time for the purpose of discharging his duties.
