

## Cities Which Allow Non-Resident Voting: Mayoral Election and Powers, and District/At-Large Provisions

<b>Cities that elect their mayor by popular vote:</b>	<b>34 of 40*</b>	<b>85%</b>
<b>Mayor can VOTE &amp; VETO:</b>	5 of 34	15%
<b>Mayor can VOTE/No VETO:</b>	4 of 34	10%
<b>Mayor can VOTE ONLY IN A TIE:</b>	23 of 34	68%
<b>Mayor has NO VOTE AT ALL:</b>	2 of 34	6%
<b>Council election At-Large</b>	23 of 34	57.50%
<b>Council election At-Large and Wards</b>	8 of 34	20%
<b>Council election by Ward/District Only</b>	3 of 34	7.5%

\*40 is the number of cities that allow non-resident voting in local elections as identified in a search of the MTAS charters database as well as searching individual commercially-produced charters. This is not intended to be a comprehensive list.

Of these 40 cities identified in the searches, 39 were private act charters and one was a home rule charter.
