Alcoa	Yes	<p>(1) Residential garbage truck backed into mailbox. Truck equipped with backup camera and also 2 workers available to spot for driver. Driver re-trained.</p> <p>(2) Front-loader garbage truck sideswiped gate post while backing. Driver re-trained.</p> <p>(3) Residential garbage truck sideswiped boat trailer. Again, truck equipped with backup camera and 2 workers available to spot. Driver re-trained.</p> <p>(4) Vac truck backed over survey level. Driver re-trained. Instituted requirement for all larger trucks to use traffic cones when parked. Then when retrieved before leaving driver must conduct walk-around and check exit routes - especially those involving backing.</p> <p>(5) Front-loader garbage truck backed into parked vehicle. Truck equipped with camera. Driver re-trained.</p> <p>(6) Front-loader garbage truck struck gate post. Same driver as incidents (2) and (5); also involved in similar accidents. Driver reassigned.</p> <p>(7) Operator packing garbage @ Landfill using a tracked high lift. Backed into a packer working in the same area. Operator re-trained.</p>
